But what happens if this gentleman is not home; you have to call another, and another, until you find one to report your trouble.

#### One number

Now, I understand that it isn't always as bad as that, but we have to use worse case scenarios. As professional and reliable that our linemen are, they have lives and families, also, and they may be gone at the moment you need them. (363-21-008-01 Michael A. Anderson) This new idea for one number would be a great service for you, our member.

#### How it could work

Let's see how this could possibly work. It's a beautiful day in the neighborhood, and you have friends and family over for birthday supper and cake. Unknown to you, there is a small bird about to come into contact with the energized line on top of the transformer. Pow! The fuse is gone and you're out of power. If you have a backup generator, then good for you, but if you're one of the 98 percent that doesn't, you'd better get on the phone, because the only light you have at the moment are the three candles burning on little Danny's cake.

#### **Toll-free call**

You call the toll-free number, and you will get a North Star representative on the other end of the phone right away, and they will have a few questions for you to answer so they can make the line crew, which they contact, aware of the situation. This one telephone call that you make will ensure you that someone will be on his way to that problem within a short time. Also, they will call you back to make sure your power has been restored. Danny can blow out the candles, and you can enjoy cake and ice cream under the bright lights!

# Rebate on ETS units ends March 31, 2003

At their board meeting on January 2, the board of directors took action to remove the rebate incentive for ETS (Electric Thermal Storage) room units and ETS storage furnaces. The ETS rebate was incorporated in the "member only" selling price of these units. North Star will honor this price until March 31, 2003. Members with projects that will not be completed before this time, such as remodeling or building a new home, must pay for the unit or make loan arrangements with us before March 31 to qualify for the incentive.

The price of the units will increase about 15 percent on April 1. If you are thinking about installing an ETS unit, now is the time to do so.

## Help Keep Your Lights On



Careless ditch burning can destroy utility poles and junction boxes, leading to unnecessary power outages. Pole damage ranges from surface charring to destruction, and may cost landowners anywhere from \$2,000 on up, depending on the location of the pole and the severity of the damage.

Please use extreme caution when burning around our electrical equipment, and always tend to a fire once it is lit. Let's all do our part to keep the lights on and costs down.

#### Off-peak rate

Tired of the load control? Me too, but I'd still rather pay the low off-peak rate in exchange for the temporary inconvenience.

There are 3,413 Btu in one kWh of electricity (100 percent efficient). We get 82,440 Btu from one gallon of LP from our super-efficient (90 percent) LP backup furnace. With the new off-peak rate at 3.1 cents/kWh, each electricity penny buys 1101 Btu. At \$1.30/gallon of LP, each super-efficient LP penny buys us 634 Btu. (A standard LP furnace is 70 percent efficient; therefore that LP penny buys you 493 Btu.)

At our home, the LP backup works like it should – automatically and adequate – so the only "hardship" is the 10 percent of the time when we have to pay more for our LP Btu.

If your backup system needs some work to make it "automatic and adequate," please contact our Member Services department. We offer loans and advice to help you get your heating system into shape so the nuisance is minimal. Our goal is to help you save money with little or no inconvenience.

The line crew is still working on annual line inspection, meter readings, equipment repairs and getting ready for the summer construction season.

Power Systems Engineering Inc. was here and staked the 3-phase 14.4 conversion job north of Williams. This job will be contracted out; it will be completed this summer.

Our crews will be doing some of the work on the step-down banks and re-insulating some of the taps that will be converted to 14.4 also. We are also planning on a small tie line between the Sandy Shores and Birch Beach areas to better serve that area in times of line trouble. (673-26-021-02 Mary Eunice Holt) This should shorten some outage time and allow us to feed from more than one way.

If you are thinking of or planning any new construction this summer, it would be good to contact us as soon as your plans are formulated, so we can get your job ready to build when the weather turns to the better and the frost is out of the ground.

With all of the off-peak control that is occurring, we are busy upgrading transformers to serve members who still realize that it is the best deal around. Let's not forget that the off-peak program is there to save us all money, and that 90 percent of the time, we still have electric heat at a very low rate. Even if it were 50 percent of the time, it would still be saving you money. Until next time, be safe!

The cold weather just hasn't let up much going into the end of February. The crew changed out some poles and installed swamp anchors in some low areas that would be very difficult to get to in the summer.

We should have all the material for the 3.5-mile line rebuild to Kinmount by next week. Then, during March, we will need to concentrate our workforce on this project and some of the pole changeouts that are in tough spots to get at. Later, when the ground does soften up, we will have the meter reading and line inspection program to finish up.

North Itasca Co-op out of Big Fork came up on Feb. 7 with their radar machine and helped us locate and fix a fault we had on an underwater cable feeding Kabetogama Narrows. We also experienced an underground fault caused by frost, along with a couple individual outages in February.

# Highlights of the board of directors meeting

February 5, 2003

These are the highlights from the board of directors meeting held on February 5, 2003. Detailed minutes are available at the Cooperative for member review. The next regular board meeting is tentatively set for April 2, 2003. If you wish to speak with the board or have an item that you would like to have placed on the agenda, please contact Manager Dan Hoskins at least one week in advance to be included on the agenda.

All directors were present. They acted upon usual, routine business. In addition they voted to accept the minutes from the Safety Committee Meeting, to adjust electric and DirecTV rates, to amend board policy 5.63 to remove the self-insuring of the first day room-andboard deductible, to ratify Manager Hoskins signatures on FEMA documents to recover a portion of the losses associated with the June 2002 flood, to reappoint current delegates to Minnkota and Square Butte, and to authorize President Arnesen to execute director indemnification agreements.

#### Office report

Office Manager Ellis provided the year-end financial report, reviewed sales graphs, and commented on the seasonal billing, the RUS loan application, and receipt of the FEMA payment for a portion of flood damages.

## Compliance and member services report

Manager of Compliance and Member Services Haukaas reported on

DirecTV issues, the satellite receiver equipment exchange program for subscribers' malfunctioning equipment, youth scholarship payouts, load control hours, increased interest in ETS units associated with the end of the sale prices on April 1st, contractor training, and ideas for the newsletter.

## **Management and operations** report

General Manager Hoskins reported on progress to implement a single phone number for all members to report power outages, the Minnkota system managers' meeting, EnPower, load control, receipt of the IRS private letter ruling regarding tax treatment on income from DirecTV sales, the Operations Staff meeting, line loss, line crew activities, safety issues, truck repairs, and outages.

## **Board reports and other discussion**

Doug Larson, Power Systems Engineering, reviewed the cost of service study and rate adjustment recommendations with the board. Comparisons to neighboring electric cooperatives' rates were also re-Minnkota Delegate viewed. Brzoznowski reported on their recent board meeting. Director Arnesen complimented employees Pat Olson and Kevin Holen for noticing a kWh usage irregularity in the meter readings and detection/ correction of the problem before it escalated to a larger problem.

# Off-Peak Loan Program for Automatic Backup Systems

If your off-peak backup heating system is in need of repair or replacement, we may be able to help.

From 1977 to 2000, we had an average of 34 hours of control per heating season. Last year, we had only 22 hours of control; the year before, we had 177 hours. This year, as of March 6, we have had 367 hours. The years of 20 to 40 hours of control are gone. In the future, you can expect 200 to 500 hours per heating season.

You must have a reliable backup heating system.

North Star Electric will lend up to \$2,500 for upgrading members' existing off-peak backup systems when the following terms and conditions are met:

- 1. On approved credit.
- 2. \$2,500 maximum.
- 3. 6 percent interest.
- 4. 1 to 3-year term.
- 5. Payment will be added to existing electric bill (\$25 minimum per month).
- 6. \$35 filing fee.
- 7. Must be existing off-peak member.
- 8. Automatic backup system only (no wood or manual systems).
- 9. Must furnish sales receipt from contractor or vendor.
- 10. Job must be completed before loan is approved for payment by member services department.
- 11. Outstanding loan balance at termination of service is due in full.
